

Creative Innovation Hub

Creative Innovation Hub in Holywood, County Down will be designed to be a centre of excellence for the creative and technology sectors in Northern Ireland specialising in film, TV and screen industries.

The Hub in Holywood has been identified as a key project eligible for funding from Belfast Region City Deal.

This new build innovation hub will cover approximately 30,000 sqft (2,788 sqm) gross, over a number of floors and be perfectly positioned to take advantage of the future growth of the creative sector over the coming years.

The overall design is at an embryonic stage, so it can be influenced by the right operator who recognises this as a long-term partnership for future growth and innovation.





What is the Belfast Region City Deal (BRCD)?

BRCD is a bespoke package of funding and decision-making powers agreed between UK central government and local regions; aimed at helping to harness additional investment, create new jobs and accelerate inclusive economic growth.

The BRCD is a catalyst for a step change in the digital and innovation capabilities of our region. It will drive investment in research and development and help embed a culture of innovation to act as a driver for increased productivity. The Creative Innovation Hub is aligned to the BRCD Innovation and Digital Pillar and this market testing exercise is to help inform the Outline Business Case for funding.

Ards and North Down Borough Council has pledged a significant level of investment aligned to Belfast Region City Deal.



Key Data Points



Ards and North Down (AND) has the highest percentage of premises connected with full fibre in NI and the 4th highest in the UK, and NI has the highest density of fibre cables meaning it's super connected.

Idea Location



Titanic Studios is less than a 10-minute drive and is one of Europe's largest film studios. Holywood sits on the creative corridor for film/TV, post-production/ sound and flourishing businesses within the gaming and animation sector, alongside AR/VR.



George Best Belfast City Airport and Belfast Docks within 3.2 km of the Borough.



150 parking spaces located on surrounding lands.



A recent report into office space and the available facilities highlighted that within Holywood, there was a significant demand for a quality workspace to meet the requirements of high-growth firms. However, the available capacity of quality space within the town is insufficient to meet this demand.



Strong public transport links. Train station within 5 minute walk of the town centre, regular buses to Belfast, Bangor, and key commuter towns.



Innovation Hub site sits off the A2. the busiest commuter road (non motorway) in Northern Ireland.

Holywood



Belfast is just 10 minutes by train, Dublin less than two hours' drive, and an international airport is located only 10 minutes away by car.

These locally grown businesses work with all the big studios as well as playing their part in the growth of the Northern Irish film and TV sector.

Nearby developments of Belfast Harbour Studios, Titanic Studios, and the new Studio Ulster (Virtual Production Studio) mean that Holywood is perfectly placed to harness the future growth of business and talent.

A key aim of the hub is to have strong links with the growing sector and foster collaboration with key partners including Titanic Studios and Studio Ulster.

There is also the opportunity to tap into a substantial 3,650m² facility including a high specification theatre with backstage facilities, industry standard music recording studios, and a range of state-of-the-art facilities just 13km away in the city of Bangor.

Creative corridor

Ards and North Down Borough Council is seeking a long-term partner to create and operate this site.

The Council has a strong ambition for the long-term growth of Holywood and has recognised that the area lacks flexible workspace options, despite a high demand for quality spaces.

Since the pandemic, there has been an even greater need for workspaces that are fully connected and community-oriented, as more businesses shift towards flexibility and the creative sector in Northern Ireland continues to expand.

Within the Borough, there is an evergrowing community of digital businesses, including local start-ups and internationally recognised companies with global reach.




The Concept

Ards and North Down Borough Council has taken the decision to build from the ground up to 'a white box' with all key facilities and HVAC.

This de-risks any issues for a potential operator in terms of the fabric of the building and will ideally be done prior to the operator taking possession (but in collaboration with the operator in the design stages). The proposal for funding covers these CAPEX works and to enable key facilities of the secondary fitout, meaning that the operator who is awarded will benefit from a building which is fit for purpose.

As this is a collaborative approach, the operator will need to have 'skin in the game' in terms of further fit-out investment. It is anticipated that the operating agreement between the Council and the operator will be at an agreed level of rent for the market.



What we are looking for

An operator to invest in and develop the hub in a long-term partnership with the Council to activate skills development and economic growth.

Interested parties should show previous experience in not only bringing a project like this to the market but also actively demonstrate the impact they have had in terms of social value additionality.


Next Steps

Market Testing

Ards and North Down Borough Council is committed to this opportunity and would like potential operators to provide feedback to inform the initial market scoping that will be used to inform the Outline Business Case. This will enable the project to be further defined, which will allow us to apply to draw down Belfast Region City Deal (BRCD) funding, and subsequently progress through the tender process.

Partnership Approach

It is anticipated that a fruitful partnership between the right operator and Council will facilitate an approach that works for all stakeholders. This will be expressed through a competitive process and subsequent commercial agreement moving forward.





The operating agreement is expected to be based on a long-term lease.

This is anticipated to incorporate:

- Lease and break options and competitive terms (to be determined).
- Collaboration opportunities with Government departments and agencies and screen industry bodies within Northern Ireland for future programmes and development.
- Business support programmes to support productivity and growth, which will provide access to a greater network for members and spaces.
- Support from Ards and North Down Borough Council for a successful delivery.


Timeline

Market testing will be conducted in summer 2023 to help inform the Outline Business Case. It is anticipated that this will be submitted as an application to draw down funding in the second half of 2023, and for tenders for operator, design and build to be progressed from 2024 onwards.


Masterplan Concept – Proposed Floor Layouts
