## **CURRENT PLANNED WORKS**

Works are continuing well around the scheme and the cobbled entrance to the Eurospar is now complete. The temporary surfacing, that was laid to facilitate the Gala, is now being excavated and these areas will soon be paved.

Northstone Ltd are continuing with the paving works within the Square and it is coming together well. Works have now commenced from the Rock bakery and heading towards the Post Office.

Granite kerbs removed from the Square previously have been reconditioned and reused on Meetinghouse Street. These granite kerbs are aesthetically pleasing and look well matched to the new kerbing and paving at the junction with High Street.

The majority of the new street lighting columns have been installed and progress is being made with the fitting of the new heads and wall brackets to the new locations in the coming days. Due to sequencing and legislative requirements, Northstone Ltd are only able to remove the old columns and heads once the new lighting is up and running which will hopefully be completed in the next few weeks.

## Schedule of Works

Some changes have been made to the work plan and dates so please see revised work plan phases below. These changes are following consultation with Dfl, and work is now to be carried out to the footpath outside the Credit Union to improve pedestrian accessibility.

Phase 1 – Trial holes and Ferry Street Oct 2023-Dec 2023

Phase 2 - Castle Street Nov 2023 - Feb 2024

Phase 3 – Market Square and Junctions of Ferry St/The Strand & Castle St/The Strand Jan 2024 – Aug 2024

Phase 4 - Meetinghouse Street July 2024 - Aug 2024

Phase 5 – Credit Union footpath and scheme conclusion Sept 2024

Market Square / Castle Street / Ferry Street / High Street / Meeting House Street.
