Background

The Department for Agriculture, Environment and Rural Affairs (DAERA) has launched an eight-week Call for Evidence on its Future Operational Protocol to assess the impacts of air pollutants, such as ammonia, on the natural environment. More information on the Call for Evidence is available at https://www.daera-ni.gov.uk/future-operational-protocol-a-call-for-evidence. The call for evidence closes on the 15 September 2023.

Detail

DAERA operates as the appropriate nature conservation body in Northern Ireland and has a duty to provide advice to planning authorities and other competent authorities on the potential impacts of air pollution, including ammonia, from plans and projects on designated sites and protected habitats. The Northern Ireland Environment Agency (NIEA) performs this function for terrestrial/freshwater environments, on behalf of DAERA. This advice is provided through the use of an Operational Protocol, currently under review.

A recent consultation on the draft Ammonia Strategy is part of a programme of work to ensure DAERA are in a position to advise ministers on their return to Government that is informed by up to date and robust evidence. The responses to the consultation are currently being considered by DAERA and the Call for Evidence is the next step in this programme of work.

As DAERA recognise that they may not have access to all evidence of relevance in the development of the future Operational Protocol, they have invited stakeholders to submit additional evidence that will contribute to the development and delivery of a scientifically robust, evidence-informed, Operational Protocol to protect our natural environment and ensure sustainable development of our agriculture sector.

Members should note that no planning applications within Ards and North Down Borough to date have been identified by DAERA as potentially having an adverse impact on air pollution and consequently there is limited evidence available that could be provided as part of the call for evidence. Officers have considered the questions posed in the call for evidence and have responded to that effect.

Those closest (1- 2km) to the designated site are only required to make a disproportional reduction relative to their likely impact which is considered to be unfair.

Option 18 is a more equitable approach - facilities/ developments potentially impacting the designated site most, by reason of their proximity, are required to make the biggest reductions. The content of Table 5 setting out the required improvements is presented accessibly.
